Dear John Snow:

This letter concerns your application for permanent residence in Canada.

Please note: Your application has been transferred to our office in Niagara Falls, Ontario. Your related family members' applications have also been transferred. This office reviews applications involving complex medical considerations that may impact medical admissibility, ensuring that those applications are processed consistently and efficiently.

Based on a review of your file, I have found that your family member's health condition might reasonably be expected to cause an excessive demand on health or social services in Canada. You therefore may be inadmissible to Canada. At this time you have the opportunity to submit additional information to address my concerns before I make a final decision on your case. You must provide this by **August 5, 2018**.

Pursuant to [subsection 38\(1\)](#) and [section 42](#) in the case of your family member, of the *Immigration and Refugee Protection Act*, a foreign national is inadmissible on health grounds if their (or their family member's) health condition is likely to be a danger to public health, is likely to be a danger to public safety, AND/OR might reasonably be expected to cause excessive demand on health or social services. Pursuant to section 1 of the *Immigration and Refugee Protection Regulations*, an excessive demand is a demand on health services or social services for which the anticipated costs exceeds the average Canadian per capita health or social services costs. This is currently set at **\$6,604** Canadian dollars per year.

On June 1, 2018, a public policy was implemented to grant an exemption from excessive demand provisions when an applicant meets certain conditions set out by the Minister. One of these conditions is that the costs of health and social services required by an applicant are less than **\$19,812** per year. This policy has been taken into consideration when determining the services and costs related to your family member's health condition. Please refer to the total costs related to your family member's medical condition in the "Health Condition Summary" located on page 2 of this letter.

I understand that hearing news of your potential inadmissibility may be unexpected and may cause distress, but this is not the intention of this letter.

Information about the medical assessment associated to the potential medical inadmissibility can be found in the "Health Condition Summary" section of this letter. Instructions for addressing my concerns, with information and templates for preparing your response to this letter, are found in the section entitled "Responding to this Letter".
